JAN. 7 Before the Beginning (Gen. 1:1–2, John 17:1–5, 20–26)

To understand who we are, we must first study who our Triune God is. Our story begins before the beginning of human history: in the Trinitarian life of God.

JAN. 14 Creation (Gen. 1:1-26)

Our fundamental identity, as human beings, is as creatures, made to worship our Creator.

JAN. 21 The Image of God: Gender (Gen. 1:27–28)

God made us male and female: why is this difference so essential to human flourishing?

JAN. 28 The Image of God: Dignity (Gen. 1:27-28)

God created us in his image: what are the implications of human dignity for all of life?

FEB. 4 The Image of God: Diversity (Gen. 1:27–28)

God delights in the diversity of his image-bearers: how does God's multi-ethnic family bear witness to his purposes in the world?

FEB. 11 The Image of God: Work (Gen. 1:28-2:15)

The Bible compares God to a craftsman, a designer, and an architect: how does God's joy for his work inform our work?

FEB. 18 The Image of God: Rest (Gen. 2:1-3)

God rested. He even established a day of rest for humanity to enjoy: how do we learn to inhabit rest, as God designed it?

FEB. 25 Marriage, Singleness, Sex (Gen. 2:18–25)

God blessed marriage between one man and one woman. How does this benediction inform our relationships, whether we are married, single, or single again?

MAR. 3 Sin, Death, Promise (Gen. 2:16-17, 3:1-19)

The grim reality of death affects us all. How do we live, with hope and joy, in the shadow of death?
